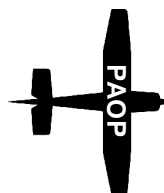

TO THE HOME OF THE HARLEYS

What better way to spend a mid-winter Sunday than flying to historic York County? From its founding as part of the earliest westward expansion of William Penn's colony to today, when it hosts the world-famous Harley Davidson assembly plant, York has been a commercial and industrial center. It also played important parts in the American Revolution and the Civil war. York considers itself the "Factory Tour Capital of the World." It might even be true; the web site lists 24 tours, from violin making to pretzel baking. The York Airport (KTHV), actually in Thomasville, PA, is a friendly place with a 5,188 foot long runway and inviting restaurant. On February 24, following a scenic, 63 nm jaunt across the farmlands of Lancaster and York Counties, we'll enjoy brunch at the Kitty Hawk restaurant in the FBO building at the north end of the airport. Use your GPS to get there or just use the old-fashioned way—follow US 30 which passes the field. Either way, if you land short on Runway 35, it's a long "drive" to the facilities at the north end. However, the

rising terrain lets you skim the runway until the asphalt rises to meet your wheels, at which point there's still plenty of length left to slow down and minimize taxiing. There's lots of brunch traffic, as well as flight training, so maintain your outside scan.

We'll gather at Penn Airways at 0930 for 1000 takeoff. Bring a friend or bring a student pilot (or bring a friend who is a student pilot). Contact Gene Poppel at 610-647-1332 or

genepoppel@comcast.net if you want a ride or have an available seat in your plane. These flights can be used to give guest or student pilots a chance to plan and follow a cross-country flight, without having to simultaneously fly the plane—a good step in their training.

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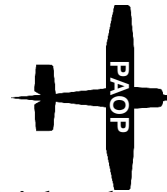

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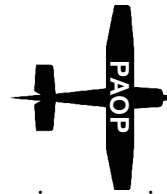
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executive committee members and offer up any ideas you have is how we might decide what would be an appropriate theme.

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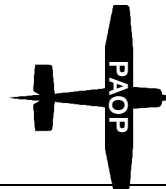
