PAOP'S ANNUAL FLYING CRABFEST

It's become a PAOP summer tradition to fly to Kentmorr for crabs. Well, for some of us it's other seafood or even a burger, since the Kentmorr Marina restaurant serves all tastes. But the big attraction is things that swim.

The Maryland blue crab, steamed and spiced, with the succulent meat picked out by your own hand is a specialty. Kentmorr Marina, a charming development on Kent Island, MD, features an airport, a beach, and the restaurant. At the restaurant we can enjoy indoor service or an outdoor deck. There's an extensive menu of lunch items, followed by some refreshing and delectable desserts. Check it out at www.kentmorr.com.

The restaurant is just a short walk from our flight destination at Kentmorr Airpark (3W3), a pretty, residential airport on the Eastern Shore's Kent Island, a few miles south of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge. This delightful spot is served by a 2,400 foot (displaced thresholds make it 2,200 feet for landing), well-tended grass airport. The airport's web site also has the current procedures for flying in. On the predictable warm day, you will want to be current on density altitude, and on short and

soft field procedures. We'll be in contact with the airport manager and checking NOTAMs for a last minute update on the condition of the field.

Take a look at www.3w3.us for airport details, including photos of some PAOP planes on a past visit. It's an easy trip down the east side of the Bay, with little concern about the Special Flight Rules Area (formerly known as the ADIZ). However, you must not stray across the bay, lest you get a close-up view of some Coast Guard helicopters. **IMPORTANT** As this flight takes you within 60 nm of the DCA VORTAC, pilots required to have taken the special online course, available on the FAA web site.

On Sunday, June 24, we'll gather at Penn Airways at 1030 for 1100 takeoff to arrive in time for lunch. All are welcome—introduce a friend to the fun of general aviation.
