**Learn Like the Pros**

TNT Air, the FBO at Pottstown Municipal Airport, is installing a new Redbird FMX simulator. Unlike typical PC-based simulations, with their limited graphics, this unit features 180 degree, wraparound screens and 3-axis motion. Time in this simulator can be logged toward flight experience requirements for your instrument rating or recurrent training.

The system is configurable for a wide variety of planes. Initially, there will be simulation of a Cessna 172 with conventional instruments and Garmin GNS 430/530 GPS and a Cessna 182 with the Garmin G-1000 full glass panel.
